- 1) Community Garage Sale and Girl Scout Troop 1382 & 2580 Donation:
 - a. Superior's annual Spring Community Garage Sale will be on May 1 and 2. The sale will run from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm on Friday and Saturday. Click [here](#) for details.
