

# Background

- Coyote Ridge was originally constructed as a mountain bike loop.
- No maintenance has been performed on the Coyote Ridge trail since construction.
- Without signage the trail has been adopted for us by runners, walkers, and bikers alike.
- Many social trails have been established and there is no great distinction between Town of Superior and Level 3 Communications property.



### **Level 3 Communications**


The “open space” property south of Rock Creek residences that borders Hwy 128, McCaslin Blvd. and Eldorado Blvd. is comprised of approximately 105 acres of Town of Superior land and 185 acres of Level 3 land.

# Pets



- Pets are allowed on this trail, but...
- To assure the safety of all trail users, unleashed dogs are prohibited on Superior trails.
- Superior Municipal Code - Sec. 7-2-40. - Dogs running at large. (a) It is unlawful for the owner of any dog to fail to prevent the dog from running at large in the Town. A dog off the owner's premises or not on private property with the permission of the property owner shall be under leash control, within a vehicle or similarly physically confined so said dog is without access to passersby. (Ord. O-12 §1, 2007; Ord. O-9 §1, 2009)
- Dog waste must be collected.
