

**MEETING OF  
PARKS, RECREATION, OPEN SPACE AND TRAILS ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
April 20, 2016, 7:00 PM, Town Hall**

1. Call Meeting to Order (**7:02**)
2. Public Comment – Anne Fenerty of 2805 Standford Ave. Boulder, CO 80305; Harvey Nichols of 4255 Chippewa Drive, Boulder, CO 80303; Jon Lipsky of P.O.Box 2492 Longmont, CO 50502; and Ted Ziegler of 2001 West 92<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Denver, CO 80602 all spoke in opposition of the proposed Rocky Mountain Greenway Trail alignment across the Rocky Flats site and encouraged the members of PROSTAC to do the same as well as oppose the Town’s participation in the FLAP grant process.
3. Bus Rapid Transit Connection Trails Presentation. Staff gave a brief presentation about the current status of the Bus Rapid Transit Connection project and the timeline for construction.
4. 2016 Playground Amenity Priorities. The group discussed potential amenities to add to the Town’s existing playground systems using \$35,000 identified in the Town’s Conservation Trust Funds. The members of the Committee would like to receive general pricing to add an embankment slide, basketball hoop, boogie board swing and tree house to various parks in Town. Staff will follow up on this item.
5. 5-year Trail Plan. Committee Chair Peter Bottomley has reformatted the trails plan making it easier for individual members to provide their ranking and opinion. Peter will distribute the plan to the group and ask for individual feedback and ranking. Staff will work to generate a trail map that correlates with the identification numbers shown on the trails plan.
6. Rocky Mountain Greenway Trail. The Committee discussed the proposed trail alignment through the Rocky Flats site and the Town’s participation in the Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) Grant and made the following unanimous recommendation:
  - Based upon the current information provided, the members of PROSTAC do not support the Town participating in the FLAP grant, and do not support a trail crossing through the Rocky Flats site.
7. Recreation Facility Usage Fees. The members of the Committee would like to evaluate the Town’s facility usage fees specific to athletic partnership groups in comparison to Boulder, Louisville, Lafayette and Erie. Staff will follow up on this item and work to have the fees by the May meeting.
