Agenda Items:

1. Boulder County POSAC Update. Margaret reviewed several current items, include the ongoing cropland policy discussion, upcoming tours, and consideration of acquiring mine properties.
2. Discussion – Follow-up from June 6 Joint Meeting with Town Board. The Committee reviewed topics from the meeting and next steps. The Hodgson-Harris Reservoir project draft IGA is pending review by Boulder County's water attorney. The land acquisition process will receive additional attention in upcoming meetings as staff assembles information on the properties not included in the Open Space Summary Report for consideration by the Committee. The meeting with Committee Chairs and the Town Manager is planned for late September. The Committee will be interested in following the progress of the Town Center development proposal, and focus on the creek corridor.
3. Discussion – Web-based Trail Mapping. The Committee will continue to look at trail-mapping options and establish a sub-committee to work on this.
4. Discussion – Topics for Joint Meeting with Louisville OSAB on August 10. The Committee is interested in discussing: web-based trail mapping, current trail projects, ConocoPhillips project from an open space perspective.
5. Updates
 - a. Rock Creek Stabilization Project – work is progressing on schedule with this project coordinated by Urban Drainage and Flood Control District. Pedestrian bridge installation is scheduled to be completed by the end of September.
 - b. Trail Connections – staff coordinated the recent completion of the new half-mile soft-surface connection along McCaslin Boulevard between neighborhoods north of Christenson Avenue and Coalton Road and the roundabout across from the new trailhead. Volunteers from Bowling Green, Kentucky, coordinated by Cool River Church, helped install the retaining wall and the section of trail north of Christenson Avenue.
