BE PART OF THE STORY

The Town of Superior Cultural Arts and Public Spaces (CAPS) Advisory Committee invites residents to participate in an historic photography project that encapsulates the experience of the Covid-19 pandemic by collecting stories and photographs of Superior residents. Be part of marking this time in history by sharing your story and having your household portrait taken. This project is meant to pay tribute to and express the resiliency and strength of our community.

ABOUT THE PORTRAIT SESSIONS

CAPS has engaged four local photographers – Liv Berger, Carol Burkett, Elizabeth Danekind and Jason Dewitt - to share their talent and commemorate this time in history by capturing outside their portraits of residents homes. Residents are invited to register for one of 80 15-minute portrait sessions of their self-defined household, first come, first served. Together with a photographer, the household will choose the outdoor location at their home. The portraits may reflect the stay-at-home activities in which the household was engaged and/or the general frame of mind felt by the household. For example, if the household often ate take-out dinner often on the patio or the kids jumped on

the trampoline a lot, this scene would be the portrait's composition.

The photographers will select one image per household that may be memorialized in three formats: 1) printed as two-dimensional prints to be exhibited in public, 2) printed as a limited-edition book to be kept in the Superior History Museum archives and in circulation at the Louisville Library and 3) used as a group to promote the project on the Town website and social media pages. Residents will also be invited to submit quotes or stories about their experience during this time, which will be incorporated into the project in various ways.
