On behalf of the National Arbor Day Foundation, it is with a great deal of honor and pleasure that I present the City of Superior with your 17th Tree City U.S.A. Award! This recognition is not an automatic renewal but is an earned distinction each year.

The community completes and submits the application. The Colorado State Forest Service reviews and forwards the application to the Arbor Day Foundation (ADF) in Nebraska City. As program administrator, the ADF makes final approval.

There are four standards each community must meet to become eligible as a Tree City U.S.A. each year. These include having -

- 1. A Tree Board or Professional Tree Manager hired by the community;
- 2. A Tree Ordinance;
- 3. A Community Forestry Program with an annual budget of at least \$2/capita; and,
- 4. An Arbor Day Observance and Proclamation.

As a **Tree City U.S.A.** community, you share with the growing number of communities in Colorado, and in our nation, the many economic, social and ecological values that healthy trees provide each of us.

- Conserving energy
- Increasing property values
