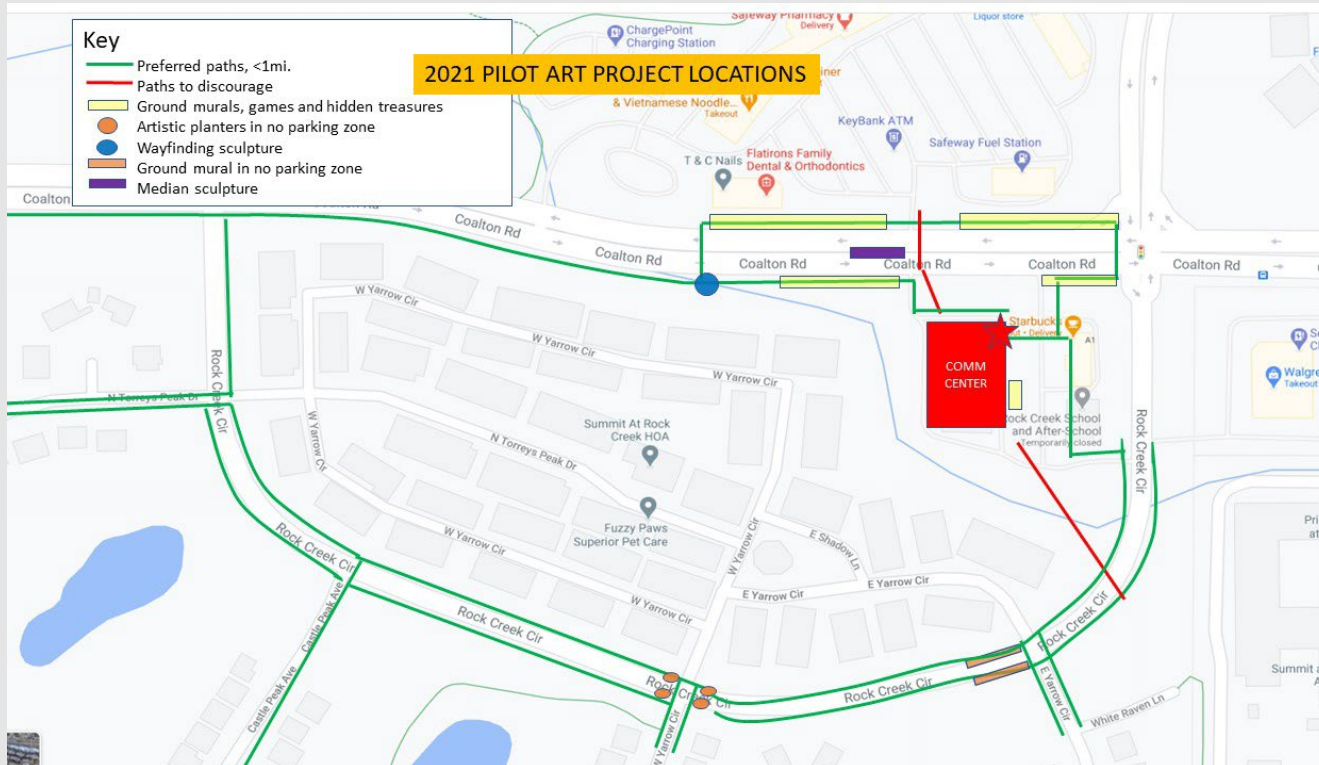

- The Superior ARtery is a creative journey in Superior activating existing pathways, highlighting points of interest, enhancing accessibility and making new connections.

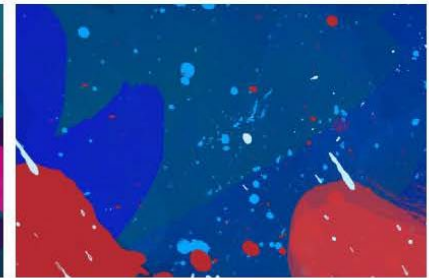

This concept includes playful silhouettes of large illustrative wildlife. One will have a moose and one will have a bear. Each silhouettes of wildlife will stand out, but yet blend in with the color and splash techniques because too representational approaches dulls the interest

White gesture lines flowing throughout the length of the mural. This breaks things up and adds a scene of layering

The background will be a gradient of bold colors and splashes throughout the length of the mural. One mural will be more cool tones, giving the energy of nature, while the other will have more warm tones, giving the energy of sun rises and sun sets.

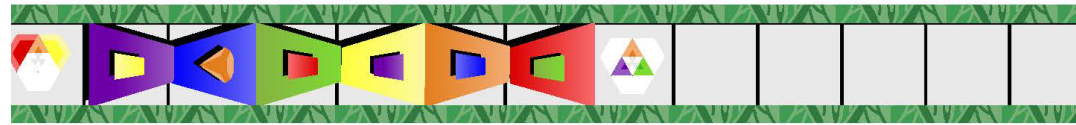

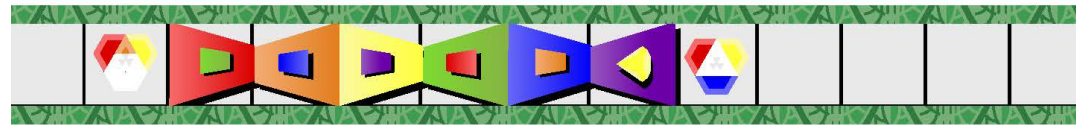

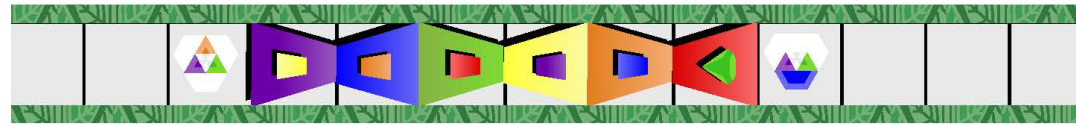
← Step on primary colors only going both directions. The red diamond is a clue to search for that diamond nearby.



← Step on secondary colors only going west and warm colors only going east. The orange diamond is a clue to search for that diamond nearby.



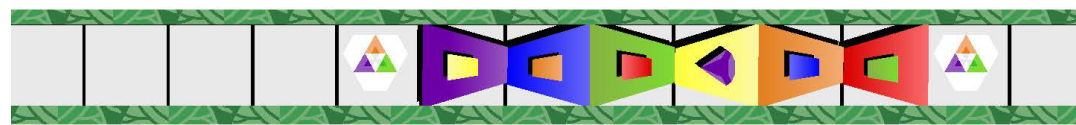
← Step on primary colors only going west and warm colors only going east. The yellow diamond is a clue to search for that diamond nearby.



← Step on cool colors only going west and secondary colors only going east. The green diamond is a clue to search for that diamond nearby.



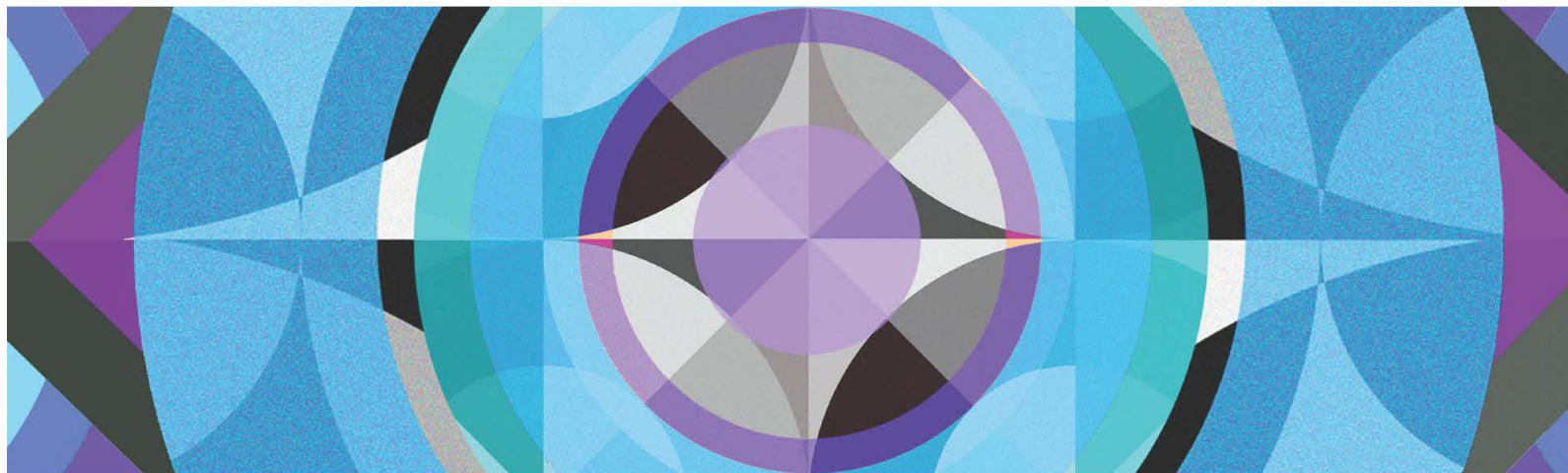
← Step on primary colors only going west and cool colors only going east. The blue diamond is a clue to search for that diamond nearby.



← Step on secondary colors only going both directions. The purple diamond is a clue to search for that diamond nearby.

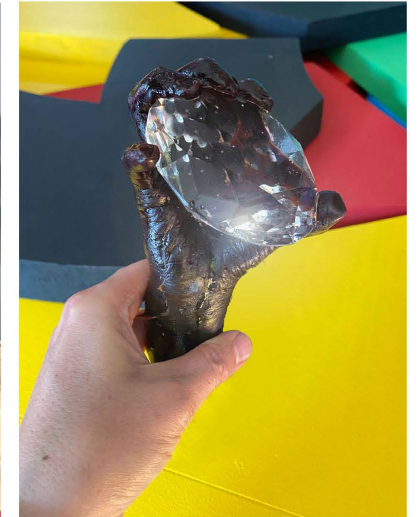

HELPING HANDS:

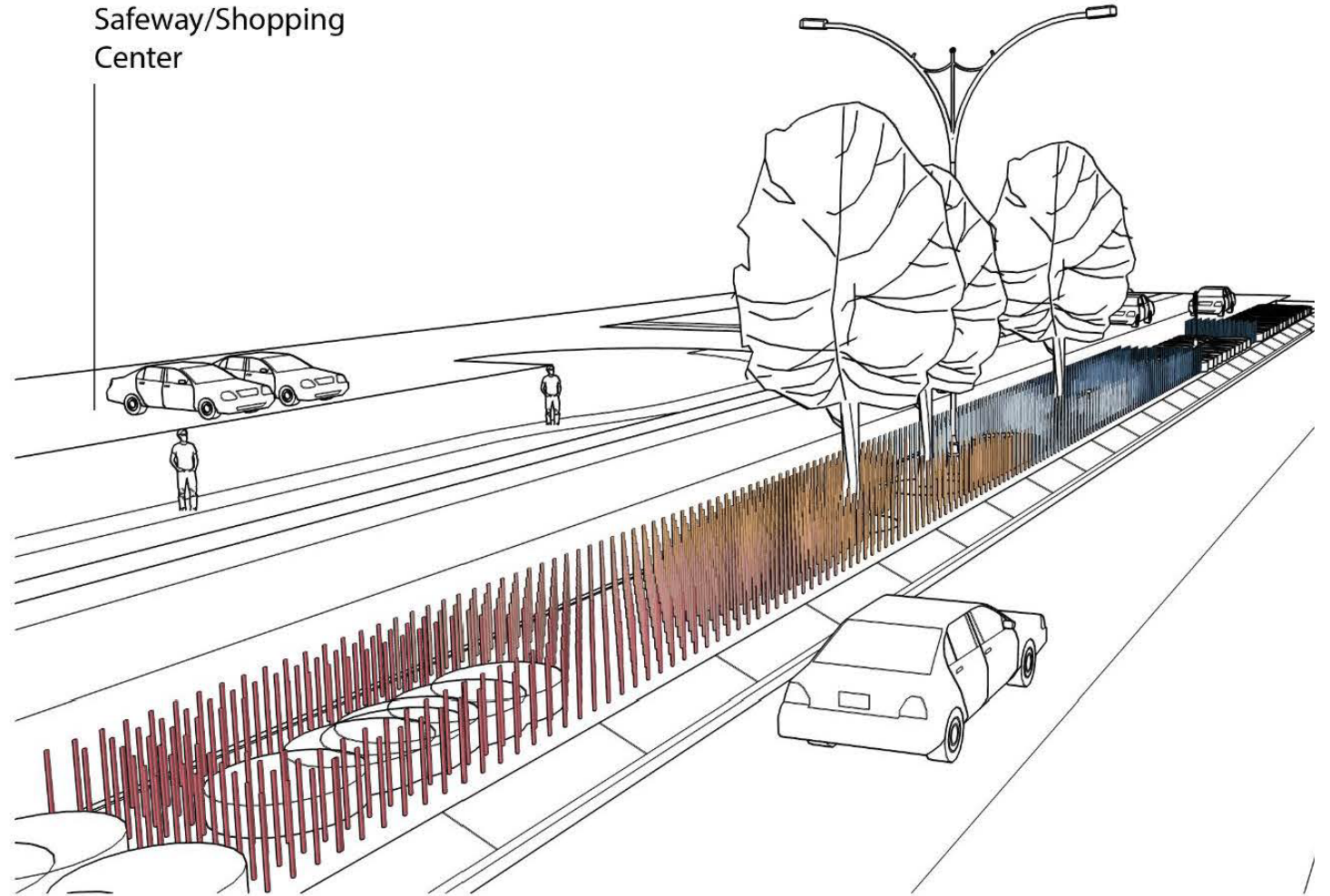

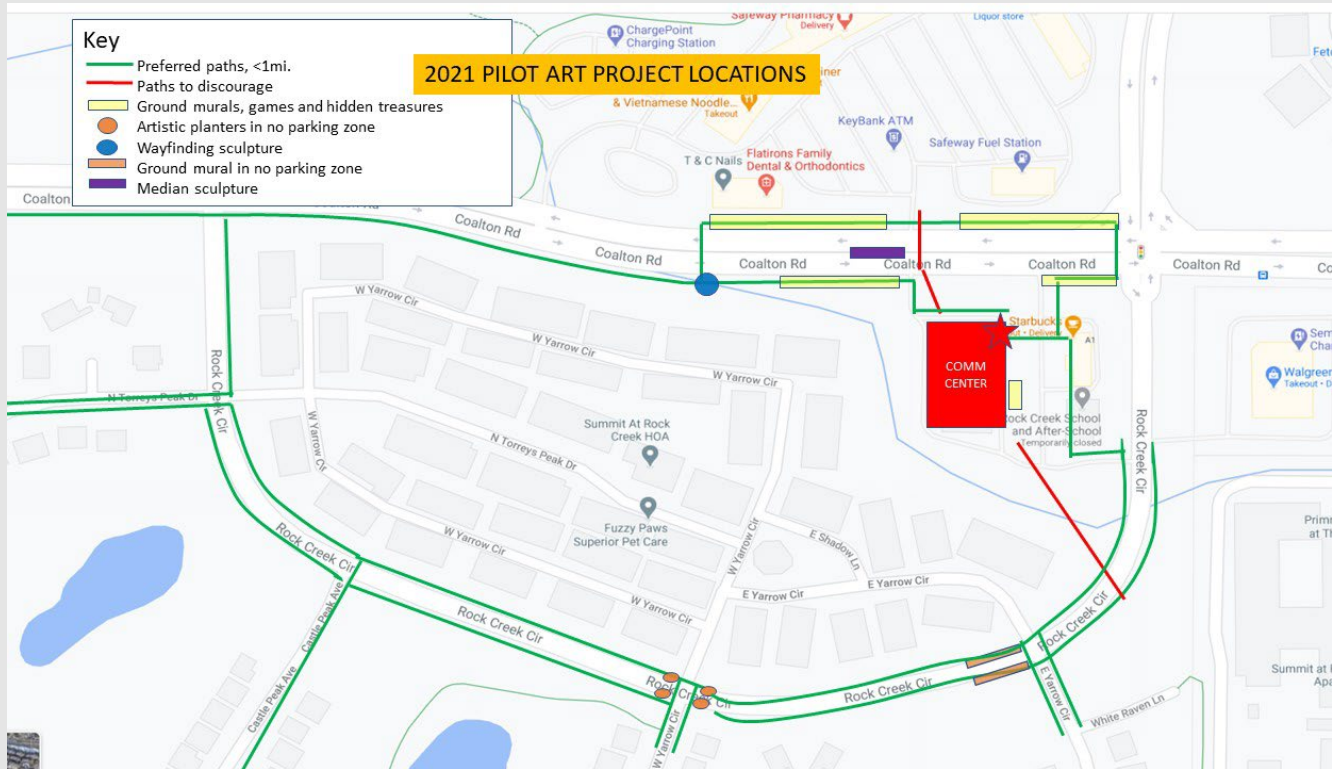
