



***A PROCLAMATION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR  
IN APPRECIATION OF SHERYL BUCHMAN***

**WHEREAS, Sheryl Buchman** is a resident of the Town of Superior and the Sagamore neighborhood, and she saved her neighbor Madalyn Peter's life the day of the Marshall Fire; and

**WHEREAS,** On December 30, 2021, the Marshall Fire burned large portions of Superior and Louisville, Colorado, devastating our local community. The fire led to the significant loss of structures, nearly 1,100 single-family homes, making it the most destructive wildfire in Colorado's history; and

**WHEREAS,** an evacuation order was issued for the Town of Superior early afternoon, the Marshall Fire was speeding across eastern Boulder County closing in on the Sagamore neighborhood, flames were within close proximity of Peter's home and only three to four feet from their back fence; and


**WHEREAS,** when Sheryl rushed over to Peter's home amid the burning fire surrounding the neighborhood, she fell down the basement stairs and managed to wake up Madalyn to escape the fire in time, saving her life, then both hurried outside into the smoke-filled air of their burning neighborhood to drive away quickly; and

**WHEREAS,** Sheryl's actions were truly heroic and deserve appropriate recognition, the Board of the Trustees is grateful and proud to have Sheryl as a member of the community;
